

## Wild Pedagogy

(In short)

Wild Pedagogy <sup>1</sup> is both a methodology and a philosophy. (The “What”, “Why” and “How” questions in education.)

Wild Pedagogy as a philosophy is based on different ecophilosophies, ecosophies and nature worth philosophy which focuses on other values, views and ethics in the relationship between nature and man, than the dominating mechanistic world view.

The methodology can be described as a way of teaching and learning in nature or in a classroom, where both the teacher and student where the students as well as the teacher let themselves or are allowed to “go wild” and wiggle, not without intention but in order to develop a deeper understanding and relation to nature
